

## **Sherrie N. Randall, CFCM**

Sherrie N. Randall, a native of Atlanta, graduated from Wesleyan College in Macon, Georgia with a bachelor's degree in Business Administration. She started her career in 2003 as an intern at the Army Contracting Agency, Southern Region Contracting Center-East at Fort McPherson, Georgia, where she received extensive training and contracting experience in the Mission and Installation Contracting Command division. Ms. Randall joined the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Office of Financial Resources (OFR), Office of Acquisition Services (OAS) staff in June 2009.

Since joining CDC, Ms. Randall has administered and managed over 40 contracts valued at up to \$900 million annually. She has also served as a mentor, assisting, reviewing, and awarding procurements processed by other contract specialists on her team and within other OAS branches. In Fiscal Year 2017, she served as lead contracting officer on a special projects team to award a \$45 million total set-aside for Historically Underutilized Business (HUBZone) Indefinite Delivery Indefinite Quantity contract (IDIQ) to support firm-fixed-price, cost reimbursement, and time and material task order contract types. The first such contract ever awarded by CDC, it will serve as a ready source of medical, scientific, administrative and professional, and technical services to support 10 program offices and help the organization accomplish its small business goals.

Ms. Randall currently serves as a lead contracting officer, heading a six-person team of contract specialists who provide acquisition support to two program offices. She is responsible for obligating an average of \$100 million in federal funds annually.

She currently serves as the program committee chair for NCMA's Atlanta chapter. She completed the NCMA Contract Management Leadership Development Program in July 2018 and received the highest honor, the Distinguished Graduate award.
